## EUDR Regulation on Deforestation

Dear Customer,

Since June 29, 2023, EU Regulation 2023/1115 on supply chains of products not originating from deforested or degraded land (EUDR) has been in force. This regulation requires companies that place on the market or export within the European Union certain raw materials or products derived from them, to ensure that these products are "deforestation free" within the meaning of EUDR, comply with applicable local laws and are supported by a due diligence process.

The regulation specifically concerns the following raw materials: beef, cocoa, coffee, palm oil, soy, wood and rubber, as well as all products derived from them that fall under the customs tariff codes (HS codes) listed in Annex I of the regulation itself.

The entry into force was scheduled for January 1, 2026, but the Council of the European Union has established its negotiating mandate for the targeted revision of the EUDR regulation by March 2026. The main purpose of the initiative is to make implementation of the legislation easier and postpone its entry into force, thus allowing operators, traders and authorities to equip themselves with the necessary compliance tools.

Based on the declarations and information received from suppliers, ITALCOPPIE SENSORI s.r.l. states that none of the raw materials and/or components used in the manufacture of its products falls under Annex I of this regulation.

Furthermore, we confirm that even products that are not made directly with renewable raw materials, such as EPDM gasket materials, are not affected by the EUDR regulation as they are of synthetic origin.

Since we know that laws, standards and available information continue to evolve, ITALCOPPIE SENSORI monitors, investigates, communicates and exercises due diligence within its supply chain to ensure satisfaction of our obligations under the EUDR regulation.
